

#### Seminole's Response to Covid-19

The City Council and the City's Emergency Management Team continue to monitor the COVID-19 situation with County, State, and National Emergency Management Agencies and continue to carefully assess each day how we can best serve our community and support our employees during these challenging times. This is a "fluid" situation and Seminole City Government is being responsive to changes in regulations, guidelines, and community needs.

The following are current changes in City Services:

- •All visitors that enter City Buildings will be required to sanitize their hands, wear a face mask, and have a wellness check.
- Allemployees will be wearing a face mask when working directly with a member of the public
- Practicing social distancing by staying 6 feet apart from others not in your party is recommended in every City Building.



- Processes are in place for online permitting and a protocol has been implemented for the drop off and review of building permits/plans. Building and Code Enforcement Divisions' phones will be staffed during the business day.
- All FireDepartmentpersonnel arefollowingtheprotocolsestablished bythePinellasCountyMedical Director.All Fire Department Stations are closed to the public.
- •The Seminole Community Library is open and provides online services and requires masks in the building.
- The Seminole Recreation Center is open to members only, along with reduced occupancy in the facility, provides online service and requires masks in the building.
- Public Works will continue with projects and will follow established CDC protocols.
- The Canoe and Kayak Launch in Waterfront Park is open.
- City of Seminole's Parks are open, including the playground areas. Public Works staff disinfects playground equipment once a day.
- •By visiting any of our parks and by using our facilities you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.

# City of Seminole's Thirteenth Consecutive Year Receiving the Distinguished Budget Award from Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA)



The Government Finance Officers Association (GFOA) has awarded the Distinguished Budget Presentation Award to the City of Seminole for its Fiscal Year 2019 Budget. This marks the thirteenth (13) consecutive year that the City has received this award. As in past years, the City Council established over-arching goals at its annual goal-setting workshop. New in the FY 2019 Budget was an Action Plan for each goal, which identified initiatives and responsibilities to move the City closer to achieving each of the goals. Long range financial plans for each of the City's appropriated funds, projected revenues, and expenses over the next five years were also incorporated in the Budget document. The financial plans help to explain restrictions on use of funds, sources of revenues, and the impact of non-recurring capital expenses on future operating budgets. The 2019 Budget also included meaningful performance indicators, for each department, providing goals and objectives for specific programs and services.

# Community Policing

As the holiday seasons approach, please remember to drink responsibly. In the United States, one person is injured from an alcohol related crash every 90 seconds and



one person will die as a result of a DUI crash every 50 minutes. Driving under the influence is a 100% preventable crime. The average DUI costs approximately \$10,000 which includes fees from towing companies, insurance, attorneys and court costs. The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office uses saturation patrols as part of an on-going commitment to reduce deaths, injuries and property damage associated with traffic crashes related to impaired driving. Please consider designating a sober driver, using ridesharing apps or a taxi service.



## Community Development

Pinellas County Utilities and the State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) have major projects that are on-going in the City of Seminole. The first project is related to Pinellas County Utilities, the County is currently overseeing the on-going replacement of two large sewer lines that run through the City. The County owns and operates two force mains that transport waste water from the Seminole area and surrounding unincorporated Pinellas County. wastewater is collected at Pump Station #PS-016 on Park Boulevard, in front of Home Depot, and pumped to the South Cross Bayou Water Reclamation



Facility (SCBWRF) via an existing 36-inch diameter Ductile Iron (DI) force main, and a parallel 20-inch diameter Cast Iron (Cl) force main. The existing 36-inch and 20-inch force mains are over 40 and 50 years old respectively. This sewer line replacement project is being accomplished using a combination of underground directional boring and open trenching down the middle of the Park Boulevard right-of-way. Replacing these aging force mains will protect public health, improve wastewater service reliability, improve operational flexibility, and protect the environment. The project is estimated to cost approximately, \$15,300,000, is currently on-going, and is expected to be completed sometime in the Summer of 2021. The second project is being coordinated by the Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT). The FDOT is implementing a capital project to resurface approximately three miles of Seminole Boulevard from 53rd Avenue North to 101st Avenue North which runs through the City of Seminole. According to the FDOT, this on-going resurfacing project is estimated to cost about \$6,800,000, and is projected to be completed sometime in the Spring of 2021. Seminole Boulevard is part of the State Highway System, and the State of Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is committed to ensuring that the roadways under its jurisdiction are safe and well maintained. 






#### Fire Rescue





Since 1922, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) has sponsored the public observance of Fire Prevention Week. In 1925, President Calvin Coolidge proclaimed Fire Prevention Week as a national observance. making it the longest-running public health observance in our Country. During Fire Prevention Week, children, adults, and teachers learn how to stay safe in case of a fire. Firefighters provide lifesaving public education in an effort to drastically decrease casualties caused by fires. Fire Prevention Week is observed each year, during the week of October 9th, in commemoration of the Great Chicago Fire, which began on October 8, 1871, and caused devastating damage. This horrific fire killed more than 250 people, left 100,000 homeless, destroyed more than 17,400 structures, and burned more than 2,000 acres of land. Fire Prevention Week 2020, in the United States, will begin on Sunday, October 4, and end on Saturday, October 10. This year's Fire Prevention Week campaign, "Serve Up Fire Safety in the Kitchen!", works to educate everyone about the simple, but important, actions they can take to keep themselves, and those around them, safe in the kitchen.

**Smoke Alarm Safety** 

Smoke alarms are a key part of a home fire escape plan. When there is a fire, smoke spreads fast. According to NFPA, working smoke alarms cut the risk of home fires in half.

- Smoke alarms should be installed on the ceiling or on a high wall, in every bedroom, and on every level of the home.
- Test your smoke alarms once a month.
- Smoke alarms should be replaced every 10 years.

When smoke alarms sound, get outside and stay outside!

Carbon Monoxide Safety

Often called the invisible killer, carbon monoxide (CO) is an invisible, odorless, colorless gas created when fuels burn incompletely. In the home, heating and cooking equipment that burn fuel can be sources of carbon monoxide.

- CO alarms should be installed in a central location outside each sleeping area and on every level of the home and in other locations where required by applicable laws, codes or standards.
- Test your CO alarms once a month.

If a CO alarm sounds, immediately move to a fresh air location outdoors or by an open window or door.

# Winter Holiday Safety

- Choose decorations that are flame resistant or flame retardant.
- Keep lit candles away from decorations and other things that can burn.
- Replace any string of lights with worn or broken cords or loose bulb connections.
- Use clips, not nails, to hang lights so the cords do not get damaged.
- Stay in the kitchen when cooking on the stovetop.
- Blow out lit candles when you leave the room or go to bed.
- Turn off all light strings and decorations before leaving home or going to bed.



#### Public Works



You may have noticed quite a bit of activity at the City of Seminole's Waterfront Park. The new ADA accessible kayak and canoe launch has been completed along with the installation of a kayak/canoe wash station. The approach and grade have been improved and Flexi-Pave was installed to make the trip to the launch smoother.

The restroom project is currently under construction with a substantial completion date set for early October 2020. The observation boardwalk project began on September 1, 2020, and the installation of two additional covered picnic pavilions began on September 7, 2020, also with a projected completion date of early October 2020.

The playground project, is an All Access playground which includes ADA accessible components, and is projected to be completed by December 31, 2020. You can find a large map displayed at Waterfront Park showing the layout of each of the park's element.

# Help Stop Recycling Contamination

Recycling Contamination continues to be a big problem throughout Pinellas County. Whether you have been recycling for decades or just started, it's worth taking a second look to make sure you are recycling correctly:

- Remember to never bag your recyclables. Always empty loose recyclables into your recycling cart and always leave plastic bags out.
- Just because something is plastic does not mean it can go into your recycling cart. Items such as plastic fruit containers and coffee pods should not be placed in your recycling cart. These items should go in the garbage.
- Another major contaminant shredded paper. Shredded paper is too small to be properly sorted at a recycling facility when it is mixed with other materials.
