The Library opened August 10, 2003, as both a public library and a college library in one integrated facility, drawing award-winning attention for its innovative merging of both high-end technology and digital information in addition to traditional library collections and services.

### A Message From Your Community Policing Officer

As we approach the holiday season, the Pinellas County Sheriff's Office wants to take this opportunity to remind you of some helpful safety tips you should keep in mind:

- Always stay alert and vigilant of your surroundings. Beware of strangers approaching you; they might try to distract you with the intention of taking your belongings or money.
- Park in well-lit areas, and make sure to lock your car doors / windows.
- Do not leave any personal belongings or shopping bags / gifts in plain sight. If possible, leave them in the trunk of the vehicle.
- Residents within the City of Seminole can also request a vacation home check by calling the non-emergency number at (727) 582-6200.
- Refrain from posting photos, status updates or "check-ins" on social media while on vacation, wait to post pictures upon your return.
- Have your mail and newspaper delivery stopped if you are traveling out of town; over-flowing mailbox and newspapers stacked up can be signs that no one is home.
- Only let people you trust know when you are going out of town. Perhaps they can be a point of contact in case of an emergency.
- If paying by credit or with debit card, use the tap to pay option when available.

Remember that your partnership plays an important role in helping us identify and apprehend any subject(s) involved in any illegal activity. The Pinellas County Sheriff's Office appreciates and values your support in keeping the City of Seminole safe for everyone!



# Holiday Fire Prevention Tips



- Do not leave food cooking unattended.
- Make and practice a fire escape plan.
- Keep anything that can catch fire (oven mitts, wooden utensils, food packaging) away from the stove top.

Cooking safety starts with YOU! Always keep a lid nearby when cooking. If a small grease fire starts, slide the lid over the pan and turn the burner off. Leave the pan covered until it is completely cooled. If a fire starts in the oven, turn off the heat and keep the door closed.





### **Picking the Tree**

Choose a tree with fresh, green needles that do not fall off when touched.

### **Placing the Tree**

- Before placing the tree in the stand, cut 2" from the base of the trunk.
- Make sure the tree is at least three feet away from any heat source, like fireplaces, radiators, candles, heat vents or lights.
- Make sure the tree is not blocking an exit.
  - Add water to the tree stand, and be sure to add water daily.
